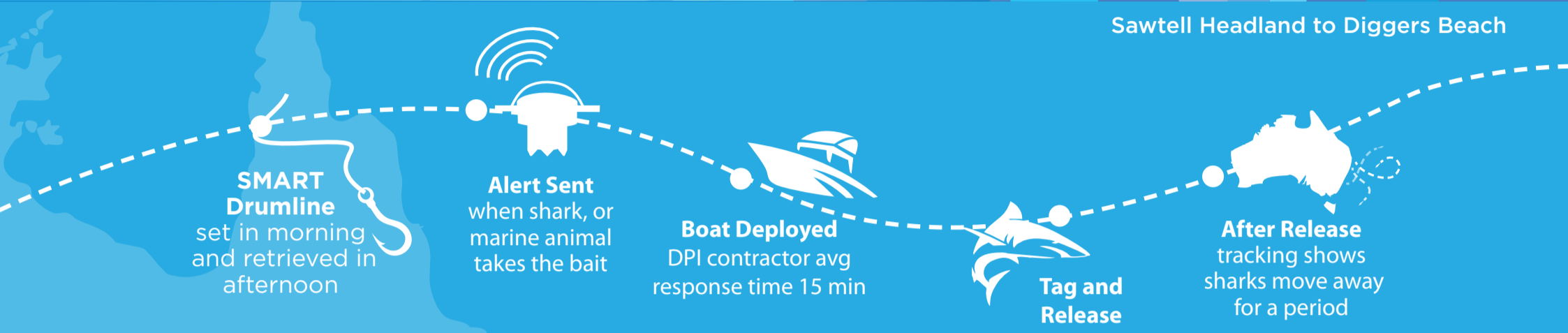
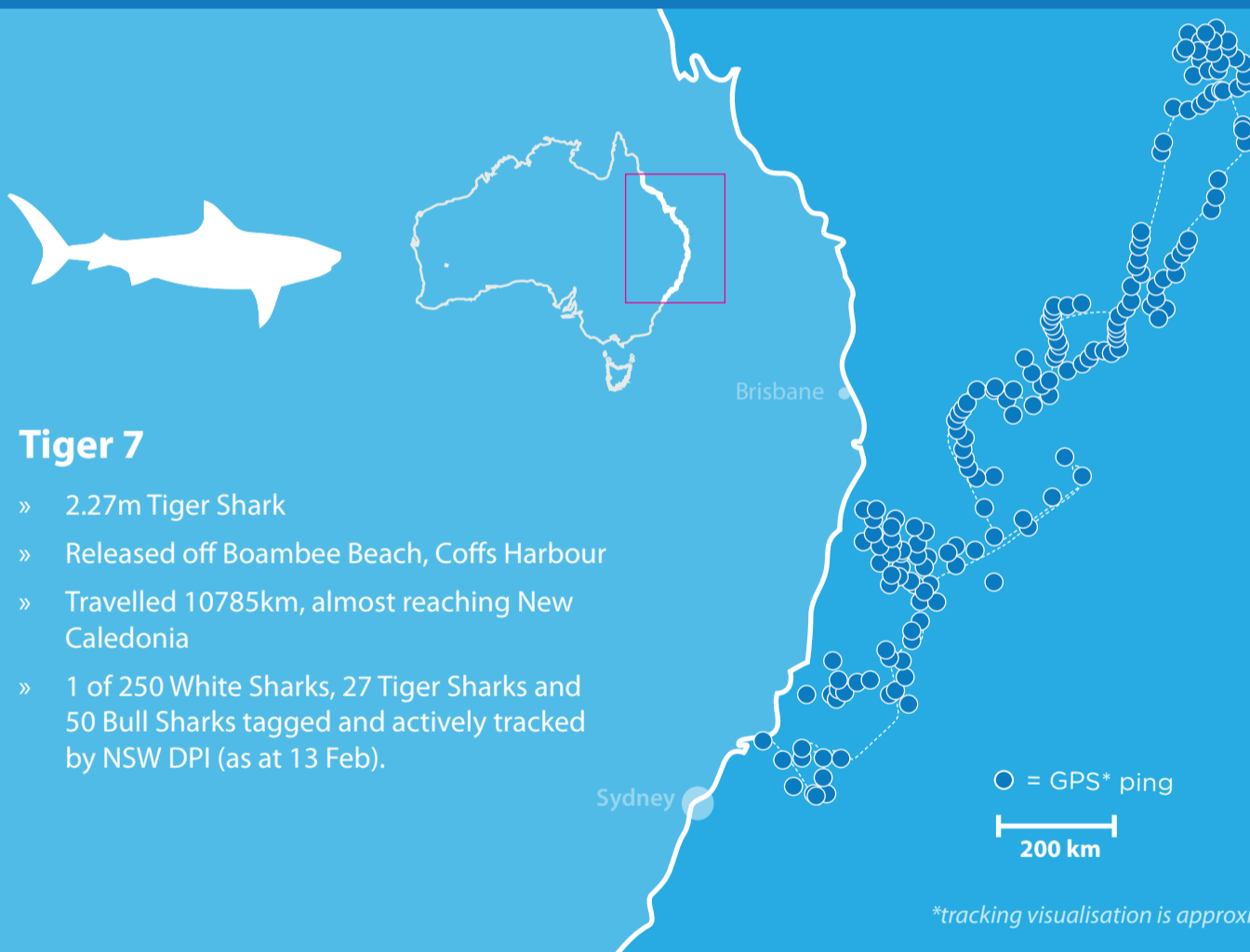

Shark Tracking Results



Tiger 7

- » 2.27m Tiger Shark
- » Released off Boambee Beach, Coffs Harbour
- » Travelled 10785km, almost reaching New Caledonia
- » 1 of 250 White Sharks, 27 Tiger Sharks and 50 Bull Sharks tagged and actively tracked by NSW DPI (as at 13 Feb).



Track Facts

Out of around 400 shark species, only 3 are considered to be a potential danger for humans - White Sharks (often called Great Whites), Bull Sharks and Tiger Sharks. Tagging and tracking results show that these 'target sharks':

Travel large distances (thousands of km's)

Use nearshore and offshore waters

Are not permanent residents at any one site

Some White Sharks tagged in NSW travelled to QLD, VIC, TAS, SA, WA and even New Zealand

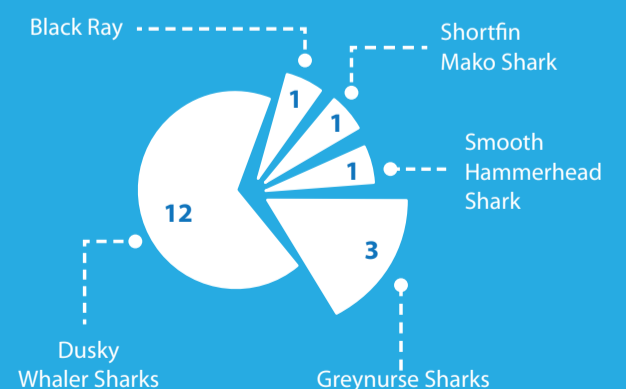
One White Shark travelled 23,500km in 18 months
